### Program Highlights:

- Inter-active teleconferences with World Language teachers from around the world.
- **A True World Language Connection Standard** that demonstrates an integrated curriculum where proficiency levels in literacy and mathematics will be increased throughout the schools of Pennsylvania.

### Participants are required to:

- Take a needs assessment and posttest on knowledge related to the content being covered in the institute;
- Participate in all Institute activities;
- Submit written reflections on selected activities, along with a standards and assessment-based Unit Plan according to the Guidelines of the Institute., and
- Apply the techniques of the institute in their classrooms upon return to school;
- Lead a workshop locally following the institute and report on the outcome.

### Location:

The Institute will be held at Villanova University from July 15-20 2007.
