STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

Please have your parent or guardian sign this form and return it to your accompanying teacher by May 10, 2005 to be faxed.

As a participant in the NCSSSMST Student Research Symposium, you are responsible for knowing and agreeing to respect and adhere to all policies and procedures outlined. These are only highlighted policies and will be reviewed during your first evening with us. As responsible young scholars, we are sure that you will behave appropriately.

ALCOHOL

The minimum drinking age in the State of Pennsylvania is 21. No one will be allowed to drink alcohol. A violation of this rule will result in the student being dismissed from the Symposium.

DRUGS

The use or possession of illegal drugs and/or any paraphernalia is prohibited on campus. A violation of this rule will result in the student being dismissed from the Symposium.

SMOKING

Smoking is not allowed in any building on campus or on sponsored field trips.

DAMAGE OR VANDALISM TO PROPERTY

Any damage to property belonging to the University or to another person may require restitution and is prohibited.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Disorderly conduct is defined as loud or aggressive behavior, which disrupts the orderly functioning of the University, or behavior that disturbs the peace and/or comfort of person(s) on campus.

EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT AND PROCEDURES

Emergency procedures will be reviewed at the first meeting of the Symposium.

QUIET HOURS

In all areas, reasonable behavior is expected at all times.

RESIDENCE HALLS PROPERTY

University property may not be removed from the living units or from the public areas.

AIR CONDITIONERS

Central air conditioning systems exist in all residential areas. Each fan in the residential college has a fan control that activates the system. Any air conditioner malfunction or leak should be reported to the reception desk immediately.

KEYS AND UNIVERSITY ID CARDS

Your room keys and university ID cards will be issued on check-in. These are very valuable items and may not be reproduced except by the University. Once you have signed for your keys and ID cards at check-in, you are responsible for them. In case of their loss please notify the reception desk immediately. A lock change will be completed, new keys or ID cards will be issued, and you will be charged a replacement fee.
